Rajanthran, 48, said that he had initially called the police to take action against his neighbour who was breaking his back door and urging him to fight. <br />My neighbour and I have been in a feud for a long time, and that day I was afraid that things would get out of hand and decided to contact the police.<br /><br /> | called 999 five times and two police officers finally came to my house at around 9 pm on Aug 1 and escorted me to the police station claiming that they wanted to take my statement on the incident, he said at The Star office here yesterday.<br /><br />Rajanthran said that once he reached the police station, he was handcuffed and kept in the police lock-up for four days.<br /><br />| was not allowed to call anyone, and the policemen who arrested me also refused to divulge the reason for my arrest, he said, adding that on the fifth day, he was finally brought to court and charged with assaulting his neighbour. He was released after his son posted bail of RM3,500.<br /><br />Johor Baru South OCPD Comm Zainuddin Yaakob confirmed that Rajanthran had been arrested after his neighbour's wife, G.
